Chhattisgarh govt to pay
Rs 25 lakh compensation

SC ordered a CBI probe into circumstances leading to custodial death.

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Wednesday ordered a CBI probe into the circumstances leading to the custodial death of a 34-year-old man in Chhattisgarh in 2024, and directed the state to pay compensation of Rs 25 lakh to his wife and children. It also said the CBI director shall ensure that a regular criminal case is registered against those responsible for the death of Shravan Suryavanshi. Slamming the state

“cover-up story and an attempt to pull the wool over the court’s eyes”. It said the facts warranted immediate registration of an FIR and a thorough investigation into the circumstances leading to the death of Suryavanshi, which the

state authorities conveniently and deliberately tried to cover up. “In the facts and circumstances of the case, we are of the firm opinion that the ends of justice require that the investigation into the circumstances leading to the custodial death of Shravan be entrusted to the Central Bureau of Investigation and that all officials found responsible for the custodial violence, upon completion of the investigation, be proceeded against and prosecuted in accordance with law,” a

bench of justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta said. It said the CBI director “shall forthwith ensure registration of a regular criminal case in relation to the custodial death of Shravan”. The bench passed the order on a plea filed by Suryavanshi’s wife and children challenging a October 2024 verdict of the Chhattisgarh High Court. The high court had held that Suryavanshi was subjected to custodial violence and died as a result thereof.

Vyapam scam

A special court for Vyapam cases in Gwalior has sentenced a ‘solver’ and the original candidate to three years’ rigorous imprisonment in an impersonation case linked to an examination conducted in Guna, officials said on Wednesday. The court sentenced Amitesh and Vipin Kumar to three years’ rigorous imprisonment and imposed a fine of Rs 5,000 on each, a CBI statement said. According to the statement, the case was registered after a person appearing as Vipin Kumar was apprehended from the examination hall at the Government PG College in Guna, after the invigilator found that his appearance did not match the photograph on record. During preliminary verification, the accused identified himself as Amitesh, a resident of Ghaziabad in Uttar Pradesh, and confessed to impersonating the original candidate, Vipin Kumar, resident of Moradabad in Uttar Pradesh, the statement said.

Tricolour, patriotic songs
replace Maoist diktats

NARAYANPUR: Hundreds of motorbikes carrying national flags sped through Bastar, long considered a hotbed of banned Maoist cadres, as the three-day Bastar Tiranga Yatra commenced, signalling a transformation towards peace and security across the region. The rally was flagged off on Wednesday from the Higher Secondary School ground in Narayanpur district by Deputy Chief Minister Vijay Sharma and Forest



Minister Kedar Kashyap, who both joined the procession on motorcycles. Over 200 motorbikes, driven by local residents and community representatives, set off amidst patriotic slogans to cover routes historically dominated by Maoist insurgency. The convoy is scheduled to conclude its journey at the

Karregutta hills in Bijapur district, situated near the Telangana border. The location holds strategic significance as the site of a 21-day joint operation by central and state security forces in April and May last year, which resulted in the deaths of at least 31 Naxals. Sharma said the yatra would pass through areas where Maoist violence had once affected people’s lives and convey to the country and the world that “Maoism has now ended in these areas”.

Judge Varma found guilty by house panel

Committee finds judge's cash explanation unsatisfactory.

NEW DELHI: Justice Yashwant Varma has been found guilty by a panel constituted by the Lok Sabha Speaker to probe allegations of discovery of cash at his official residence with the committee saying the charges of unexplained cash, disturbing evidence and evasive explanation against him “are proved”. In its report submitted in both houses of Parlia-



ment on Wednesday, the three-member committee constituted under the Judges (Inquiry) Act said the former Delhi High Court judge failed to furnish satisfactory explanation on the presence, source or ownership of cash found in the store

room of his official residence. The panel also said that material evidence was not secured or preserved and the evidentiary condition of the storeroom was disturbed before the lawful sealing and inspection. It also found that the explanation by Justice Varma did not exhibit candour, transparency and institutional responsibility expected in the circumstances. “It remained evasive and unsatisfactory when tested against the evidence of independent official witnesses and

corroborative material,” the panel said in its final report. “The Committee therefore records its final findings that Articles of charges I, II and III are proved,” the probe panel said in its consolidated findings on the articles of charge against Justice Varma. The report is in two volumes along with oral and documentary evidence recorded during the course of the investigation. The three-member probe panel had submitted its findings to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla in May.

Fair appointments

The Supreme Court on Wednesday said compassionate appointment is a welfare measure intended to provide immediate financial assistance to the family of a deceased employee. A bench of Justices Aravind Kumar and Vipul M Pancholi said the scheme should be interpreted in a fair and reasonable manner so that its object is achieved and not defeated. “It is well settled that compassionate appointment cannot be claimed as a matter of right, but at the same time, it is a welfare measure intended to provide immediate financial assistance to the family of a deceased employee. Therefore, the scheme should be interpreted in a fair and reasonable manner so that its object is achieved and not defeated,” the bench said.

Mumbai women biker dies
after unidentified vehicle hit

Mumbai biker Riddhi Thakkar dies in Markatola accident.

BALOD: A 24-year-old woman from Mumbai, who was part of a group of motorbikers on a tour of Bastar region, died after her two-wheeler was hit by



an unidentified heavy vehicle in Balod district on Wednesday morning, police said. The accident

occurred around 6 am at Markatola Ghat under Purur police station limits on the National Highway 30, and the deceased was identified as Riddhi Thakkar, a resident of Borivali (West) in Mumbai, an official said. A group of around 20 motorbikers from different parts of Maharashtra and some other states

had arrived in Raipur earlier and was travelling towards the Bastar region when the accident occurred, he said. Thakkar was riding a Bajaj Avenger when her motorcycle was hit by the unidentified heavy vehicle, leaving her seriously injured, particularly in the legs, the official said.

Multi-storey
building fire

A toddler and a woman were killed and six others, including a fireman, were injured after a fire broke out in a 12-storey residential building in Mumbai’s Vile Parle area, civic officials said on Wednesday. The blaze erupted in two flats on the 11th floor of Shanta Bhavan building at around 10 pm on Tuesday. The fire spread to electrical wiring and installations, an AC unit and other household articles in an area of around 4,000 square feet in the two houses, the officials said. Eight persons, including a fire brigade personnel, were injured and rushed to two hospitals.

Trained youths secure rural placements

NEW DELHI: The Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) has trained 18.38 lakh rural youth but placed 11.94 lakh, with the government acknowledging an overall placement ratio of around 65 per cent against the scheme’s 70 per cent target, according to a parliamentary panel report. The Standing Committee on Rural Development and



Panchayati Raj, headed by Congress MP Saptagiri Sankar Ulaka, has flagged the placement gap as well as inadequate post-placement salaries, saying these were contributing to high dropout rates and distress migration. “The

Committee are concerned to note the significant gap in placements under the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) where a large number of trained rural candidates remain

without employment outcomes alongside inadequate average post-placement salaries that contribute to high dropout rates and distress migration,” the report said. The scheme aims to provide regular monthly wages at or above minimum wages to rural poor youth and has a minimum placement requirement of 70 per cent of those trained, including at least 50 per cent in wage employment.

Parliament passes Bill to
rename Kerala as Keralam

NEW DELHI: Parliament on Wednesday passed a bill to rename Kerala as Keralam, with the Rajya Sabha clearing the legislation with a voice vote. The Lok Sabha passed the Kerala Bill, 2026, on Tuesday. Minister of State for Home Affairs Nityanand Rai said the Kerala Assembly passed a resolution in 2024, urging the Centre to bring a law

to change the name of the state to Keralam. “The bill provides that the State of Kerala will be known as the State of Keralam, and hence there is a proposal to rename the State of Kerala to Keralam,” he said. The Kerala government had forwarded a resolution passed by the state assembly regarding the name change to the Centre in June 2024. Subsequently, the President of India referred a

Bill to the state legislature for expressing its views, and later, the state assembly adopted a unanimous resolution agreeing with the Bill. The Kerala Bill provides for such alteration of the name of Kerala and contains necessary amendments to the provisions of the Constitution and also consequential provisions, according to the Bill’s statement of objects and reasons.

NAYA RAIPUR: The 5th edition of CII Green Steel & Mining Summit 2026, organized by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), was inaugurated today by Arun Sao, Dy Chief Minister of Chhattisgarh and Lakhan Lal Dewangan, Minister of Commerce and Industries, Government of Chhattisgarh. ‘Enforce SC directives on missing persons strictly’

RAIPUR: Chairman of the Chhattisgarh Urdu Academy Idris Gandhi, welcomed the recent directives issued by the Supreme Court regarding missing person cases and called for their effective implementation across Chhattisgarh. He emphasized that accountability must be fixed for any delays in registering First Information

Reports (FIRs) in such matters. Highlighting the apex court’s ruling, Idris Gandhi pointed out that the Supreme Court has made it clear that no discrimination based on age or gender can be made when registering an FIR for a missing person. He urged the Chhattisgarh government to establish a uniform system across all police stations in the state to ensure the immediate fil-

ing of FIRs upon receiving information about a missing individual. He further advocated for fixing accountability at the senior police officer level to monitor compliance. “The initial period immediately following a person’s disappearance is critical. Any delay in action severely hampers search operations and causes direct distress to affected families,” Idris Gandhi stated.

Candidates hold rally demanding 2nd list

RAIPUR: Around 2,000 candidates who appeared for the Chhattisgarh Police Recruitment Examination 2023-24 (conducted for 5,967 posts) took to the streets in the state capital on Wednesday, demanding the release of a second

selection list. The protesting candidates expressed frustration over the current selection outcomes, stating that only 4,000 candidates were selected across the primary and waiting lists combined, leaving roughly 2,000 vacant positions unfilled and putting their futures in jeopardy.

Villagers threaten highway blockade and I-Day boycott over land allocation

Public anger has erupted in Rasni Gram Panchayat over administrative efforts to transfer 22 hectares of govt multipurpose land to the DTIC.

RAIPUR: Public anger has erupted in Rasni Gram Panchayat over administrative efforts to transfer 22 hectares (approximately 54 acres) of government multipurpose land to the District Trade and Industry Centre (DTIC), bypassing an explicit Gram Sabha resolu-

tion against the move. Led by Raipur Zila Panchayat member Vatan Angnath Chandrakar, local residents submitted a memorandum to the Station House Officer (SHO) of Arang Police Station, demanding the immediate cancellation of the land allocation. Representatives and villagers issued a direct ultimatum: if an official order halting the land transfer is not issued by the morning of August 15, residents will boycott Independence Day celebrations and launch an indefinite chakka jam (road blockade) on the National Highway starting at 9:00 AM.

‘Emphasis on making the co-op system more transparent’

RAIPUR: A high-level review meeting was held at the Chhattisgarh State Cooperative Marketing Federation (MARKFED) under the chairmanship of Authorized Officer Shashank Dwivedi. The meeting aimed to finalize preparations for the upcoming Kharif marketing year 2026-27 ahead of scheduled and ensure seamless service delivery to farmers. During the meeting, a detailed assessment was conducted regarding



paddy procurement, fertilizer distribution, financial management, and the progress of branch-wise operations; instructions were issued for the speedy resolution of pending matters. The meeting reviewed the disposal of paddy procured during the Kharif year 2025-26, paddy lifting

by millers, rice deposition with the Food Corporation of India (FCI) and NAN, custom milling, transportation arrangements, and the status of remaining paddy stocks at cooperative societies. Officials were directed to ensure the timely disposal of paddy and the effective utilization

of storage capacity. While reviewing preparations for the upcoming Kharif season 2026-27, special emphasis was placed on timely completing arrangements regarding procurement center infrastructure, availability of gunny bags, necessary equipment, human resources, farmer

registration, CCTV, internet connectivity, and electricity supply, ensuring that farmers face no inconvenience during paddy procurement. The fertilizer distribution system was also reviewed in detail. Instructions were issued to ensure adequate supply—aligned with demand for the upcoming season—covering the availability of fertilizers (including Urea, DAP, and NPK), society-wise distribution, storage, stock verification, transportation arrangements, and stock management.

RMC seals commercial properties over longstanding arrears

Zone 8 authorities in Raipur sealed eight commercial properties belonging to long-term tax defaulters after they ignored final notices.

RAIPUR: In a strict enforcement drive led by Municipal Commissioner Sambit Mishra, the revenue department of Zone 8 executed sealing operations against eight major commercial defaulters across Wards 1, 2, and 21 for failing to clear long-pending municipal dues despite receiving multiple demand bills, notices, and final warnings.

The operation was conducted under the supervision of Additional Commissioner of Revenue Lokeshwar Sahu, Deputy Commissioner of Revenue Dr. Anjali Sharma, and Zone 8 Commissioner Rajeshwari Patel, with guidance from Assistant Revenue Officer Mahadev Raxell and execution by Revenue Inspector Rajesh Mishra along with Assistant Revenue Inspectors Rakesh Dubey and Shivendra Singh. The targeted properties included commercial establishments belonging to Omprakash Tiwari, owing Rs 75,237, Surender Singh, owing Rs 82,554, and Rahul Dhariwal, owing Rs 2,11,633, all located in Veer Savarkar Nagar Ward 1. Three arrested for plotting liquor shop robbery to repay debt

BILASPUR: Masturi Police and the ACCU have arrested three of four accused allegedly involved in an attempted robbery at a government composite liquor shop in Gatora.

Police said the accused had planned the robbery to repay their debts. The fourth accused remains absconding.

the cash, they fled with some liquor bottles, the two guards’ mobile phones, a CCTV camera and DVR.

A motorcycle, scooter, two mobile phones, gas cutter, grinder cutter machine, chisel and knife were recovered.

Police are searching for the fourth accused, who had reportedly worked with CMS Info Systems and was involved in cash collection from government liquor shops. His role is also being investigated.

Cong launches campaign against smart meters

Eight minors flee observation home

BILASPUR: The Chhattisgarh High Court has taken serious note of the security arrangements at Child Care Institutions (CCIs) after eight minors escaped from a government observation home in Mahasamund.

The court directed that the Central Government be made a party to the case and sought its response from the Union Home Ministry on financial assistance and other support sought by the state government to strengthen security at CCIs.

According to a news report cited by the court, the eight minors escaped from the Mahasamund observation home on August 4. One was reportedly involved in a rape case, while the others were linked to cases under the Excise Act NDPS Act and theft.

The minors allegedly broke a window grille and cut through barbed wire installed on a roughly 12-foot-high boundary wall to escape.

NARCOTICS

Youth arrested with narcotics in Sirgitti

BILASPUR: Sirgitti Police arrested a 32-year-old man for allegedly possessing narcotics during an ongoing crackdown on illegal drug transportation and sale. Police seized 5.32 grams of Original Gangster OG, a Kia Seltos car worth around Rs 7 lakh, and an Apple iPhone 16 Pro valued at Rs 50,000. The total value of the seized items was estimated at Rs 7.65 lakh. Acting on a tip-off that a man was carrying the narcotic substance in a black Kia Seltos to sell it, police intercepted the vehicle near Tifra New Bus Stand. The substance was allegedly recovered from the possession of Shobhit Jajodia alias Akshat (32), a resident of Link Road, Tarbahar.

Collector cracks down on private schools

Patil said he had raised the issue during the recent monsoon session of the state legislature, where the BJP-led government had assured that an inquiry would be conducted and appropriate action taken. However, he alleged that no action had followed and illegal activities had continued.

Assam flood rehabilitation to require over Rs 1K Cr: Sarma

GUWAHATI: Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Wednesday said more than Rs 1,000 crore may be required to repair damaged properties and rehabilitate people affected by the latest wave of floods in the state. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has assured full assistance from the Centre, Sarma said. A rapid damage assessment launched on August 9 has so far covered more than 8,000 families, with losses estimated at Rs 150 crore. The assessment will continue until August 30 and is expected to cover 50,000-60,000 families in severely affected Upper Assam districts, with the



final survey likely to conclude in September. Sarma said the government was exploring a model housing scheme to provide permanent relief to families whose homes were completely damaged. He also announced Rs 11.3 crore for rebuilding 494 flood-damaged Anganwadi centres, with each receiving up to Rs 2.5 lakh. Around 64,891 flood-hit families have received Rs 15,000 each, while another 31,212 families will receive the assistance soon.

BNHS sterilizes over 2,950 dogs

The Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS) has sterilised more than 2,950 free-ranging dogs in Ladakh to protect the vulnerable black-necked crane, the organisation said on Wednesday. The initiative, launched in 2022 in collaboration with the Indian Army, Animal Husbandry Department and Department of Forest, Ecology & Environment, aims to reduce dog attacks on crane eggs and chicks. Free-ranging dogs also disturb nesting birds and affect their breeding behaviour, BNHS said. Fewer than 100 black-necked cranes, regarded as Ladakh's state bird, survive in India.

Delhi police seize 1,398 reels

Three men were apprehended in west Delhi for allegedly storing and transporting banned Chinese/plastic manjha, with 1,398 reels of the prohibited kite string recovered from a car, police said on Wednesday. The accused, Rajesh, 33, Asad, 23, and Sohail, 19, were apprehended late Tuesday night, and the vehicle allegedly used to transport the manjha was seized. A case has been registered at the Crime Branch police station in PushpVihar.

'Oppn promoting urban naxal'

Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav on Tuesday accused the Opposition, particularly the Congress, of misleading people through its policies and alleged that its actions appeared influenced by an “urban Naxal” mentality that obstructs development. Speaking at the launch of the book NaxalMukt Bharat, authored by BJP national spokesperson Tuhin A. Sinha and DrAlok Kumar Dwivedi, Yadav said Madhya Pradesh had achieved its target of eliminating Naxalism within the stipulated timeframe under Prime Minister Narendra-Modi's leadership.

SHIMLA: Heavy and widespread rainfall disrupted normal life across Himachal Pradesh on Wednesday, forcing the closure of 313 roads and damaging essential infrastructure. The India Meteorological Department has forecast a wet spell in the state until August 17 and issued a yellow alert for heavy rainfall at isolated places until August 18. Dhaulakuan recorded



the highest rainfall at 80.5 mm since Tuesday evening, followed by Jattion Barrage with 67 mm, Dhamshala 57.2 mm, Palampur 54.6 mm, Paonta Sahib 50.8 mm, Bajaura 37 mm and Nahana 26.5 mm. According to the State

Emergency Operation Centre, 313 roads, 65 water supply schemes and 112 transformers were affected by Wednesday afternoon. Mandi was the worst hit, with 117 blocked roads, followed by Chamba with 74, Kullu 60 and Shimla 36.

Parliament passes bill amending NCDC act to boost India's cooperative sector

NEW DELHI: The Rajya Sabha on Wednesday passed the National Co-operative Development Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 2026, aimed at expanding the mandate of the National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) and enabling



it to provide loans and grants directly to cooper-

ative societies and entities engaged in cooperative development. The Lok Sabha had passed the bill on Tuesday. The NCDC, a statutory organisation under the Ministry of Cooperation, was established in 1963 under the National

Cooperative Development Corporation Act, 1962. Replying to the debate, Minister of State for Cooperation MurlidharMohol said the amendment would not involve any additional budgetary financial assistance from the government.

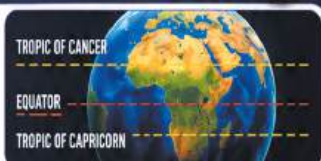

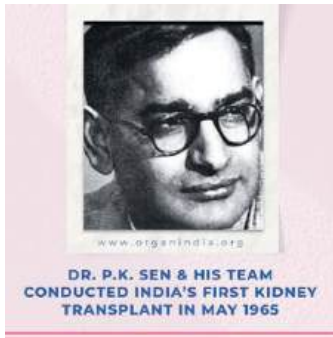

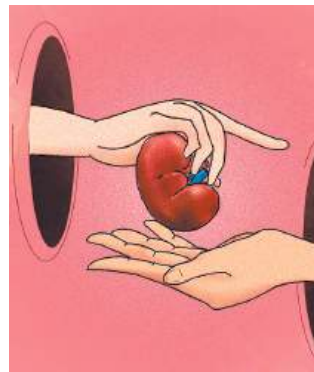

First transplant in India



The first recorded successful human organ donation and transplant took place on December 23, 1954, between two twin brothers. The historic surgery was performed by Dr. Joseph E. Murray, while in India the first kidney transplant was performed by Dr. P. K. Sen in 1965.

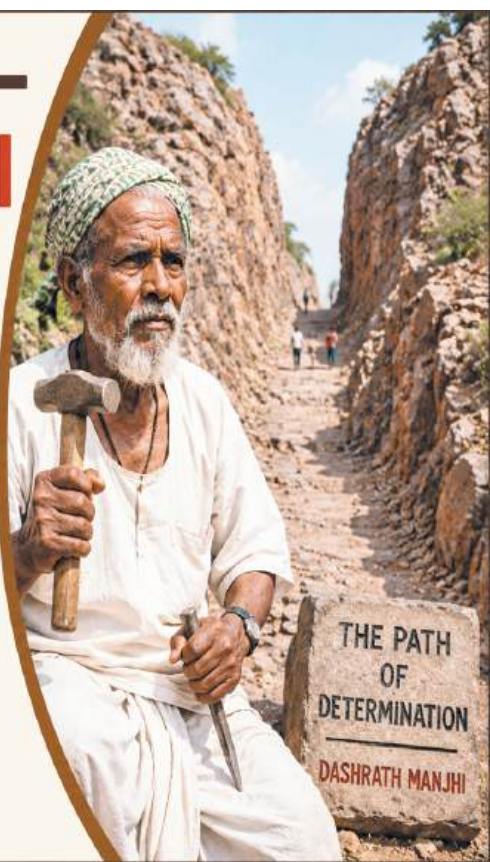
Time is crucial



Deceased organ recovery only takes place after a rigorous, independent neurological determination of brain death by attending physicians, completely separate from the transplant team. Thus time remains very crucial.

MOUNTAIN MAN - DASHRATH MANJHI

Dashrath Manjhi was a labourer from Bihar who became famous as the "Mountain Man." Using mainly a hammer and chisel, he spent about 22 years cutting a pathway through a rocky hill. His work dramatically shortened the distance between his village and nearby essential services. Manjhi undertook the task after his wife was injured while crossing the difficult terrain. His determination made him a lasting symbol of perseverance and selfless service.

HALLSTATT, AUSTRIA

Hallstatt is a picture-perfect village nestled between the Dachstein Mountains and the crystal-clear waters of Lake Hallstatt in Austria. 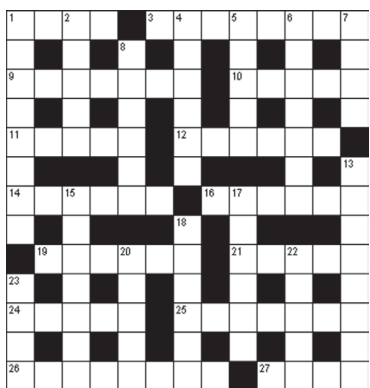

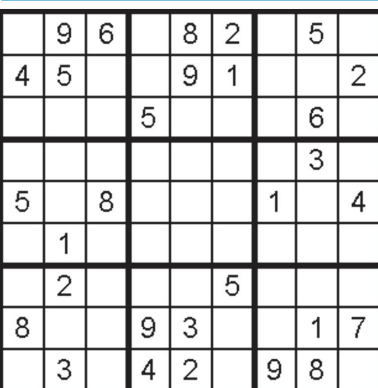

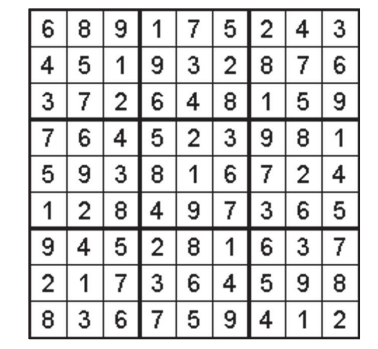

N Chandrasekaran to exit Tata Sons amid expansion

NEW DELHI: N Chandrasekaran will step down as chairman of Tata Sons when his current term ends on February 20, 2027, wrapping up a nine-year tenure that transformed the scale and breadth of one of India’s most influential conglomerates but ended with a standoff with Tata Trusts Chairman Noel Tata over his reappointment. Chandrasekaran, 63, who has spent 40 years with the Tata Group, told the Tata Sons board on Wednesday that he would not offer himself for another term and asked the directors to decide

on a successor soon to ensure an orderly transition. His decision comes after a six-month impasse over his reappointment and marks the end of what would have been an unprecedented third five-year term at the helm of Tata Sons. “I have completed 40 years of professional life at the Tata Group. I am grateful for the immensely satisfying opportunity to contribute to this venerable institution,” Chandrasekaran, widely known as Chandra, said in a statement.

NBCC Q1 profit rises 17% to 158 cr despite revenue decline

NBCC’s consolidated net profit rose to Rs 158 cr in the first quarter of the current fiscal.

NEW DELHI: State-owned construction and PMC firm NBCC Ltd reported a 17 percent year-on-year increase in consolidated net profit for the quarter ended June 30, 2026, even as its total income declined during the period. Consolidated net profit rose to Rs 158 crore in the first quarter of the current fiscal from Rs 135.03 crore in the corresponding quarter a year ago. The profit growth came despite a contraction in total income, which fell to Rs 2,320.90 crore in the April-June quarter from Rs 2,465.48 crore a year earlier, according to the com-

pany’s regulatory filing. The numbers point to an interesting divergence in NBCC’s first-quarter performance: the company generated higher profits on a smaller revenue base. This suggests that factors such as project mix, cost control, operating efficiency or other income may have supported the bottom line, although the filing’s detailed financial breakup would be needed to identify the precise drivers. NBCC operates primarily in project management consultancy (PMC), engineering procurement and construction and real estate development. As a public-sector project execution agency, its performance is closely linked to the flow and execution of government and institutional infrastructure projects. The fall in revenue, therefore, remains

‘No manipulation in closing auction sessions’

MUMBAI: Sebi chairman Tuhin Kanta Pandey on Wednesday said that the capital markets regulator has not observed any manipulations in the newly introduced closing auction sessions system.



Speaking on the sidelines of an event here, Pandey urged the broader ecosystem to understand the new system and adopt it. He said a lot of markets, including those in

Australia, Europe, the US and Japan, have adopted a similar system for over two years and India is behind its counterparts. He said such a system, which was

started on August 3, is useful for passive investors, generation of the correct net asset values for mutual funds and index investors. The earlier system had the risk of manipulation with late trades, he added. When asked if the regulator has seen any manipulation in the new system, he said no manipulation has been observed. “Basically, the CAS is a transparent market, the pricing there is always visible and participation should grow

in it,” Pandey said, adding that Sebi is engaged with all the stakeholders to understand their feedback. The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) is willing to tweak the system if need be, he said, adding that at present, our problem is with understanding the system. Meanwhile, Sebi is mulling to come out with a new paper on its findings on the losses suffered by retail investors in the derivatives market in the

next 8-10 days, according to Pandey. He said some of the results will surprise the ecosystem and stressed that such strategies of executing trades on expiry days are not as simple as they are made out to be by some retail investors. Earlier, speaking at the Global Commodity Conclave, Pandey said the growth in the market is encouraging, but the scale alone is not enough as India is a major producer and consumer of several commodities.

Sensex falls 188 pts amid elevated crude oil prices; Tata Group stocks decline after N Chandra’s exit



MUMBAI: Falling for the second day, benchmark BSE Sensex closed lower by nearly 188 points on Wednesday following elevated crude oil prices and selling in TCS and other Tata Group shares after N Chandrasekaran said he will not seek reappointment as Tata Sons Chairman when his current term ends on February 20, 2027. The 30-share BSE Sensex declined 187.90 points, or 0.24 per cent, to settle at 77,966.35 with its 21 constituents ending lower, eight with gains and one unchanged. During the day, it tumbled 656.32 points, or 0.83 per cent, to 77,497.93 but recovered some of the losses in the closing session. Index major TCS dropped by 3.71 per cent after N Chandrasekaran announced that he will step down as

chairman of group holding company Tata Sons when his current term ends in February 2027. Chandrasekaran, 63, has spent 40 years with the Tata Group, which includes his stint as TCS CEO from 2009 to 2017. The 50-share NSE Nifty dropped by 35.75 points, or 0.15 per cent, to end at 24,435.95. Among Sensex shares, Mahindra & Mahindra, Tata Steel, Larsen & Toubro, Eternal and Infosys were the major losers. State Bank of India, Bharti Airtel, UltraTech Cement and Power Grid were among the winners. “Markets remained on edge ahead of key inflation readings in India and the US, with policymakers on both sides underscoring a data-driven approach amid heightened global uncertainty.

Gold races to Rs 1.59 lakh/10g; silver rises Rs 4,000

NEW DELHI: Gold prices rose for the seventh consecutive session, surging Rs 2,600 to Rs 1.59 lakh per 10 grams in the national capital on Wednesday, tracking firm global trends and strong bullion demand. The yellow metal of 99.9 per cent purity appreciated by Rs 2,600 to Rs 1,59,800 per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes) from Tuesday’s closing level of Rs 1,57,200 per 10 grams, according to the All India Sarafa Association. It had gained Rs 12,400, or 8.4 per cent, over the past seven sessions from Rs 1,47,400 per 10 grams on August 3. Silver also advanced Rs 4,000 to Rs 2,46,000 per kilogram (inclusive of all taxes). The white metal had settled at Rs 2,42,000 per kg in the preceding session. Gold rose in the domestic markets as investors increased safe-haven buying ahead of the US inflation data, while persistent geopolitical tensions in West Asia supported demand for precious metals, Gaurav Garg, Head of Research at Lemonn Markets Desk.

Shares of Tata Consultancy Services fell 3.71 per cent, Tata Consumer Products edged lower by 2.44 per cent, Tata Elxsi declined 2.23 per cent, Tata Motors Passenger Vehicles dropped 1.92 per cent and Tata Steel slipped 1.57 per cent on the BSE. The stock of Rallis India declined 0.95 per cent, Trent dipped 0.86 per cent, Tata Power skidded 0.53 per cent, Indian Hotels Company slipped 0.52 per cent, Tata Communications was down 0.37 per cent and Titan lost 0.18 per cent. The combined market valuation of these firms eroded by Rs 45,615.67 crore, with TCS alone taking a hit of Rs 32,743.69 crore. law and judicial directions. Banerjee said he first raised the issue with Birla in June, when the individual disqualification petitions were filed against the MPs, but nearly two months have passed without any satisfactory response.

"I had already raised this issue with the speaker in June, when individual disqualifica-

tion petitions were moved against each of them. Nearly two months have passed since then, but I have still not received any satisfactory response. Even today, I have been given essentially the same answer, while the petitions remain pending," he told reporters outside Parliament.

When Cash Clouds Trust In Judiciary

The parliamentary panel's findings in the case involving former Delhi High Court judge Yashwant Varma raise serious questions. At stake is public confidence in the judiciary and the ability of institutions to protect evidence when allegations concern those entrusted with administering justice. The controversy began after a fire at Justice Varma's official Delhi residence on March 14, 2025. Firefighters allegedly discovered large quantities of burnt Rs 500 notes in a storeroom. The panel constituted by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla has concluded that the former judge failed to offer a satisfactory explanation about the presence, source and ownership of the cash. It has also described his response as lacking candour, transparency and institutional responsibility. These are grave findings. Judges enjoy constitutional protection and decisional independence, but neither places them beyond scrutiny. Judicial authority rests on credibility. When unexplained cash is reportedly found within an official residence, a convincing account is indispensable. Troubling, too, is the panel's criticism of the handling of evidence. Its report says the storeroom was disturbed before lawful sealing and inspection, material evidence was not properly preserved, and the subsequent disappearance or non-availability of the currency remains unexplained. Such lapses weaken the search for truth and encourage speculation. The committee, however, did not find proof that Justice Varma personally removed the cash. That qualification is important. Institutional accountability cannot be built on insinuation; conclusions must remain confined to evidence. The earlier in-house judicial committee's finding that he had "active or tacit control" over the storeroom is relevant, but it is not a substitute for proving every allegation. Justice Varma's resignation may have rendered parliamentary removal proceedings infructuous, but it cannot close the matter. The authorities must determine how the evidence disappeared, who disturbed the storeroom and whether procedural failures were accidental or deliberate. The episode demonstrates why transparent protocols are essential whenever allegations involve functionaries. Judicial independence and judicial accountability are not competing principles. Both are necessary to preserve the credibility of the courts and the system they serve.

Kerala Retains Traditional Vande Mataram Rendition

The Congress-led UDF government in Kerala has decided to continue the state's established practice of singing the first two stanzas of Vande Mataram at official functions, following discussions over an administrative circular concerning Independence Day celebrations. The circular, issued by Kerala Chief Secretary Bishwanath Sinha, had called for adherence to the Central protocol for Independence Day events, including the rendition of Vande Mataram. State ministers, however, indicated that Kerala would maintain its customary practice of singing the first two stanzas, which celebrate the beauty, fertility and natural abundance of the motherland. The issue has also renewed attention on the historical background of India's National Song. Vande Mataram, composed by Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay, played an important role in inspiring the freedom movement and became a powerful expression of patriotism. In 1937, the Indian National Congress decided that the first two stanzas would be used for public and national purposes. The decision followed consultations involving prominent national leaders and intellectuals, including Rabindranath Tagore, Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, Subhas Chandra Bose and Maulana Abul Kalam Azad. Over the decades, Vande Mataram has retained a special place in India's national consciousness. The present discussion highlights the importance of respecting established traditions while ensuring that national celebrations continue to promote unity, patriotism and shared respect for India's freedom movement.

Independent Director Dilemma: Experience Does Not Equal Readiness

Every year, a fresh cohort of accomplished executives – CEOs, CFOs, business heads with two decades or more behind them – starts looking at the boardroom as the next natural step. They have run businesses, managed P&Ls and led teams through cycles of growth and disruption. Surely a board seat is simply a quieter version of the same job, minus the daily grind. It is not! And this misunderstanding sits at the heart of what can be called the Independent Director Dilemma: a growing pool of capable, well-credentialed executives chasing a role whose fundamental nature is different from the one they have spent their careers mastering.

India's Independent Director ecosystem has expanded considerably. The IICA's Independent Directors Databank, the mandatory registry every aspiring ID must join under the Companies Act, now carries more than 25,000 registered names. Every listed company is required to have at least one-third of its board composed of independent directors. Public companies above certain thresholds must have at least two. SEBI's board diversity norms have added momentum – the requirement for at least

one independent woman director, first applied to the top 1,000 listed companies and later extended to the top 2,000, has meaningfully reshaped recruitment patterns and, in turn, compensation. Nifty 50 companies now pay independent directors an average package that has crossed Rs 3 crore annually, once sitting fees, commissions and committee responsibilities are added up. This looks like a booming, high-value market. In practice, it is a narrow one. The demand is not for 25,000 generalists; it is for a much smaller number of people who bring something specific – sector depth, functional expertise in areas like risk, technology or ESG, prior board exposure, or a particular kind of judgment a board currently lacks. The gap between the size of the registered pool and the size of the pool that companies consider "board-ready" is where the dilemma really lives.

Very few Indian boards fill an Independent Director vacancy through open advertisement. The process typically runs through a mix of channels: the Nomination and Remuneration Committee identifying a specific gap on the board and then working with search firms, personal networks, industry bodies, or

promoter and institutional investor recommendations to find someone who fits that gap precisely.

This is a subtler process than executive hiring. There is no single "best candidate." There is a candidate who completes the board's composition. A board that already has strong finance and legal representation is unlikely to add another CFO-background director, however distinguished; it is more likely to look for someone with consumer insight, technology depth, or international market exposure. Boards think in terms of collective capability, not individual brilliance. Fit is not a bonus criterion, it is the primary one. Boards also look beyond credentials to conduct. They want to know how a candidate has behaved in prior board settings – whether they ask hard questions without derailing meetings, whether they can disagree with a promoter or CEO constructively, whether they understand the difference between oversight and interference. Reference checks among fellow directors, not just among management contacts, have become a quiet but important part of the process.

Three things tend to matter more than a long operating resume: specific, relevant industry or functional knowledge that maps to an

actual gap on that board; exposure to how boards function; and temperament – the ability to exercise judgment without needing to run the business.

This is often the hardest for accomplished operators to internalise. A board seat is not a smaller version of the corner office; it is a different kind of role altogether, closer to stewardship than execution. An operator is paid to decide and to act. An Independent Director is expected to question, to test assumptions, to protect the interests of shareholders who are not in the room, and to know when to step back and let management do its job. The executives who make this transition successfully are the ones who treat it as a genuine shift, not a lateral move. They invest time in understanding governance and compliance formally, not just experientially. They are honest about which specific gap they fill on a given board, rather than presenting themselves as a fit for any board.

For the growing number of executives eyeing this path, the question worth asking is not "Am I experienced enough?" but "Am I ready, and am I relevant to what this particular board needs right now?" That distinction, more than years of experience, decides who actually gets the seat.

Protecting UPI While Ensuring Financial Sustainability

As UPI transforms India's payment landscape, proposed transaction charges raise concerns over affordability, financial sustainability, global competition and protection of the country's digital infrastructure. by Ram Kishore

India's Unified Payments Interface (UPI) has emerged as one of the world's most successful examples of digital public infrastructure. By making instant payments simple, affordable and widely accessible, it has transformed everyday transactions across the country. The debate over introducing a framework for charges on some UPI transactions, however, raises an important question: how can India make the system financially sustainable without weakening its greatest strengths?

UPI processed about 241.6 billion transactions in 2025-26, demonstrating the extraordinary scale of India's digital payments revolution. More than 555 million users are now part of the ecosystem, making UPI a formidable digital payments platform.

Its rapid growth has also changed the competitive landscape for traditional card networks. International payment companies such as Visa and Mastercard operate in a market where UPI and RuPay have expanded significantly, particularly in everyday retail



payments. The debate over a possible UPI levy must therefore be considered from both domestic and international perspectives. Concerns have been raised internationally about competition and market access in India's digital payments sector. At the same time, banks, payment companies and infrastructure providers have argued that processing billions of transactions

while maintaining cybersecurity and technological capacity involves substantial costs.

India consequently has legitimate reasons to examine how UPI should be financed in the long term.

The government has supported the zero-Merchant Discount Rate (MDR) model through financial incentives. The Union Budget for 2026-27 allocated Rs 2,000 crore to

promote low-value UPI and RuPay debit-card transactions. However, the continuing expansion of UPI has intensified the debate over whether the present model can remain sustainable indefinitely.

The crucial question is who would ultimately bear any additional cost.

If charges eventually affect small traders, street vendors or ordinary consumers, UPI

could lose one of its biggest advantages—affordability and universal accessibility. A carefully calibrated system that protects small transactions and smaller merchants while examining charges for large commercial transactions could offer a more balanced approach.

India must also ensure that changes to its digital-payment framework are determined primarily by domestic economic priorities and public interest. International competition is welcome, but regulatory decisions should preserve innovation, consumer choice and fair competition without undermining successful indigenous payment infrastructure.

UPI is more than a payment mechanism. It represents India's technological capability, financial inclusion and growing digital confidence.

Any reform should therefore balance financial sustainability with affordability, competition and consumer protection. The objective must be to strengthen UPI for its next phase of growth while preserving the accessibility that made it a global success.

NEW DELHI: Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju on Wednesday accused the Congress of “running away” from a debate on students’ protests over the NEET paper leak, saying it is “unthinkable and incomprehensible” that the Opposition would shun a talk when the government is ready to respond.

“I am totally frustrated and I am seeing for the first time where the government is ready for discussion, the opposition is running away,” Rijiju told reporters.

The remarks came against the backdrop of Union Home Minister Amit Shah urging Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla to consult the Opposition on holding a debate on the students’ protests

over the NEET paper leak and consequent protests, saying he is ready to answer all questions in the House. The home minister’s remarks came just a day before the Monsoon Session comes to an end. Disruptions marred both Houses of Parliament throughout the current session.

Protests and slogan-eering by the Opposi-

tion initially started over the NEET paper leak and extended to alleged embezzlement of donations at the Ram Temple in Ayodhya. Gehlot slams Centre over fund cuts, ‘low’ coverage of coaching scheme for SC, OBC students

JAIPUR: Former Rajasthan chief minister Ashok Gehlot on Wednesday targeted the BJP-led Centre over the implementation of a free coaching scheme for SC and OBC students, alleging that a parliamentary committee report has exposed the government’s claims of social justice.

Gehlot, in a statement, claimed that only 223 students, or 6.4 per cent of the target of 3,500, received coaching under the scheme in 2023-24, while the figure stood at only 12.3 per cent in 2025-26. He also alleged that the budget for the scheme was reduced from Rs 47 crore to Rs 20 crore. “This is not negligence but a deliberate policy,” the Congress leader said, alleging that the government was seeking votes from SC and OBC communities while reducing



allocations for an education scheme benefiting their children. Gehlot said the parliamentary committee itself observed that the government’s response was unsatisfactory, describing it as an indication of its intent. He said the Congress government in Rajasthan introduced the Anuprati Coaching Scheme, under which thousands of SC, ST and OBC students were given priority and a platform to prepare for competitive examinations. **PTI**

However, the commissioning of the Farakka Barrage in 1975 severely disrupted its migratory pathway, causing a drastic decline in the middle and upper Ganga and affecting riverine fishing communities dependent on the species.

According to the Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute (ICAR-CIFRI), two hilsa weighing a combined 740 grams were found in the river near Markandey Mahadev Temple in Chandauli district of Uttar Pradesh, nearly three decades after the species

Farhan's cryptic take on film exits raises eyebrows

Farhan Akhtar's cryptic remark sparks fresh speculation surrounding the controversial Don 3 project.

His comments recall past film exits, drawing comparisons with Ranveer Singh's departure.

Farhan Akhtar's Don 3 has come under the spotlight after the filmmaker made a cryptic comment about actors leaving films close to their shooting schedules. Although he did not name Ranveer Singh or refer to the controversy surrounding the project, his remarks have sparked speculation. Ranveer's reported exit from Don 3 weeks before filming was scheduled to begin had triggered a dispute between the actor and the makers. The matter also reached industry bodies, with reports suggesting disagreements over the project and financial losses allegedly caused by the sudden change. Farhan recalled a similar situation involving Saif Ali Khan during the making of Dil Chahta Hai. He explained that a scheduling conflict with another film put Saif in a difficult position and made him consider leaving the project. Farhan said he was devastated by the possibility because, after meeting Saif and developing the character, he could not imagine anyone else playing the role. He recalled that the team tried to convince the actor to stay,

but the situation remained uncertain. According to Farhan, the issue arose a month before filming was scheduled to begin. He then observed that such last-minute exits appear to have become the pattern in the industry. “That was too heartbreaking for me,” Farhan said while describing the experience. He added that it happened about a month before filming, “which seems to be a

pattern nowadays,” before jokingly saying that such situations happen beyond his films as well.

While Farhan's comments were about his earlier experience with Saif, the timing has inevitably led to comparisons with Don 3. The film's future remains uncertain following Ranveer's departure, while the reported financial dispute surrounding the project continues.

Pitt sees AI driven comeback of mid-budget films

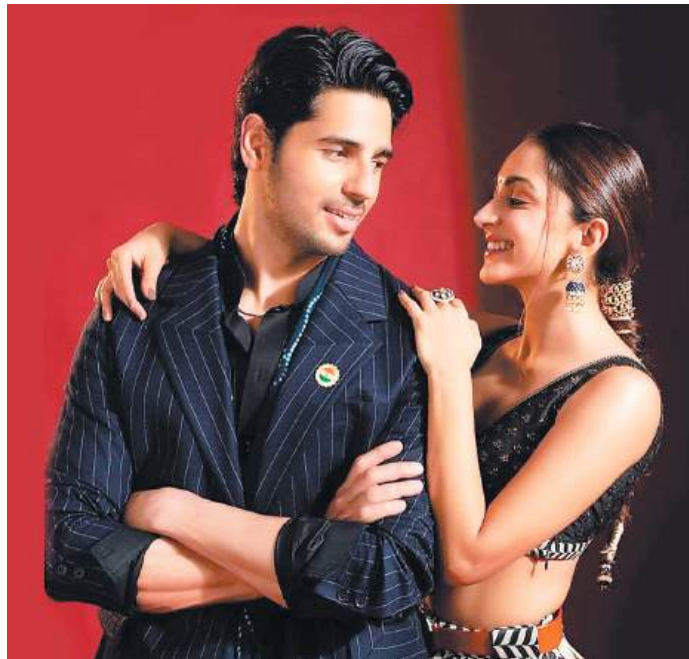

Random bilateral era ends as formats seek reinvention: ICC CEO

ICC CEO Sanjog Gupta says contextual scheduling and reinvention are essential for Test and ODI cricket to remain relevant amid rapidly expanding T20 leagues worldwide.

Tests require optimal scheduling, adequate marketing support and compelling competitive standards worldwide.

NEW DELHI: The era of “randomly” scheduling bilateral series is over, but the much-debated ODI format can continue to survive and thrive with its place “inextricably” linked to the World Cup, International Cricket Council CEO Sanjog Gupta has asserted.

Gupta shared his thoughts on the Test and one-day formats at a time when their future has been constantly debated in the age of mushrooming T20 leagues.

“The era of randomly scheduled bilateral series has to come to an end, because countries will not be able to sustain cricket without context, culture, competition and competitiveness, which require significant investment of resources, both financial and non-financial,” Gupta said.

“It’s important to stay focused on the four levers which drive attention and affiliation – context, culture, competition and competitiveness – and ODIs can continue not just to survive, but thrive.”

He said there is a place for the format in the product portfolio, which is inextricably linked to

men’s and women’s ICC Cricket World Cups.

Bilateral cricket is decided exclusively by member boards without the ICC’s intervention.

The world body only handles the scheduling of multinational competitions such as the World Cups and the World Test Championship.

As things stand, only the big three – India, England and Australia – can afford to play Tests, while other full members are struggling to mone-

tise the longest format. ODIs too have become less attractive in the age of T20s, the chosen format for the game’s global growth.

Gupta said cricket can learn from marquee events in other sports, such as Wimbledon and The Masters, to engage with fans across age groups.

“Our ambition has to be growth; our ambition should never be to maintain the status quo. Because in this world, where population is growing, attention is getting disaggregated and affiliation is hard to sustain, if you’re not growing, you’re dying,” he warned.

“There is obviously value in high-quality Test cricket. There is prestige, legacy and a sense of heritage associated with it, but if prestige, legacy and heritage are not made relevant and amplified, then the product can become burdensome.”

Gupta said Test cricket needs to be served in a manner appealing to the new-age audience. The World Test Championship has been successful in adding more meaning and context to the format.

Test cricket, he said, needs optimal scheduling, adequate positioning and marketing support, competitive teams, suitable playing conditions and the promise of compelling cricket for fans.

Sports Ministry suspends TTFI over governance issues

NEW DELHI: The Sports Ministry on Wednesday suspended its recognition of the Table Tennis Federation of India and asked the Indian Olympic Association to form an ad-hoc committee to administer the sport, citing governance deficiencies within TTFI. In its order, the ministry cited TTFI’s failure to conduct elections on time as one of the reasons for the suspension after getting an “unsatisfactory response” to a show cause notice issued earlier. “The IOA, in consultation with the international body (ITTF) will take appropriate action to create an internal regulatory mechanism, including the constitution of an ad-hoc committee, till such time that a duly constituted governance structure is restored in TTFI,” the ministry order stated.

Sreejesh urges India to trust training under pressure

Former goalkeeper asks players to stay calm and enjoy the World Cup.

NEW DELHI: Former India hockey goalkeeper PR Sreejesh has urged the current players not to let the pressure of the World Cup affect their game, asking them to trust their preparation and enjoy the occasion.

The FIH World Cup will be jointly hosted by Amstelveen, Netherlands, and Wavre, Belgium, from August 15 to 30.

The Indian men’s team is led by Harmanpreet Singh, while the women’s side is captained by Salima Tete. The men’s team, which has won back-to-back Olympic

bronze medals, will aim to end its long World Cup podium drought. India last finished on the podium in 1975, when it won gold.

“The whole world is watching, and all eyes are on you. That brings a lot of pressure,” Sreejesh told JioStar.

“But you cannot let that pressure affect your game. When you start

thinking too much about it, your performance drops. And when your performance drops, the pressure increases even more. So the key is to stay calm, focus on your role, and trust your training,” he said.

India will open against Wales on August 15 before facing England and Pakistan.

you are playing in the World Cup. This is what you have worked for. Just enjoy the moment and give your best on the pitch,” he added.

“We have the quality and the depth to achieve that. Anything beyond that, silver, gold, or bronze, would be a bonus. We should not settle for less,” he said.

Siraj eager to write his own script in spinner-friendly Galle

With Bumrah absent, Mohammed Siraj must lead India's pace attack and challenge the spin-dominated narrative during the two-Test series against Sri Lanka in difficult conditions.

Siraj averages 25.4 as lead bowler across 17 Tests without Bumrah present.

GALLE: Spinners running amok on the slow turners in Galle and Colombo has been the dominant theme in the build-up to the two Tests between India and Sri Lanka, starting here Saturday.

While it is not far off the truth, one bowler will be eager to write his own script across the next fortnight or so – Mohammed Siraj.

In the absence of premier pacer Jasprit Bumrah, Siraj will have to assume the lead role, besides handholding Prasidh Krishna and Gurnoor Brar.

It's not precisely an unfamiliar place for Siraj, for he has stepped up to the plate several times when Bumrah was either rested or injured.

A quick rewind to last year's Birmingham Test against England will attest that statement.

Siraj produced a match-defining spell of six for 70 in the first innings when Bumrah was absent because of his workload management.

Siraj bowled a stag-



gering 1113 balls in that series, picking up 23 wickets, but here the 32-year-old will certainly not have to deliver that many balls.

But his role will not be any less significant in the series against the Islanders.

It's a bit of an anomaly but Siraj shines even brighter when Bumrah is not operating from the other end.

Bowling alongside the phenom, Siraj has taken 90 wickets from 29 Tests, and averages 32.

However, in the 17 Tests where he was the

lead bowler, Siraj has taken 50 wickets and average plummets to a creditable 25.4.

Siraj loves attention but he does not have the main character syndrome.

"He has always been a tough competitor. He does not shy away from a challenge. It comes from his tennis ball background where you need to bowl many overs continuously.

"Of course, once he joined the Indian team, he has worked tirelessly over his fitness, and he can bowl one or last ball

of the day with the same intensity. That way he has not changed at all," says Mohammed Mahboob Ahmed, who mentored Siraj at the Charminar Cricket Club in Hyderabad.

Intensity will be Siraj's biggest asset in the upcoming two-match series where pitches will not offer him much assistance, nor will there be too much for him in the humid Lankan air save for the initial hour.

But he will have to overcome it with his characteristic zest to be the leader when top dog

Bumrah is absent.

Siraj can combine stock and shock to telling effect even on benign tracks. He has this uncanny knack to produce a breakthrough when it is absolutely necessary.

It could be a magic incoming delivery that leaves the batters completely short of an answer, or a common-placed full length ball that at times can fetch an inside edge. All these could be his weapons against the Lankans here.

Add to it his ability to conjure some lusty blows down the order with the bat, and Siraj transforms into a compelling package.

Recently, the Hyderabad man hammered three sixes in a row to carry India to win over a Sri Lanka Cricket XI in a warm-up match in Colombo.

More than his ability, it symbolises his will to win at any cost and from any circumstances.

"Bachpan se hi woh aisa hi tha (He was like that from his younger days). Never liked defeat or never accepted defeat. He will lead from the front if the team finds itself in a pressure situation," says Mahboob.

Praggnanandhaa beats Sindarov in Sinquefield Cup
