

PMC staff protest over GST arrears, salaries

The Parbhani Municipal Corporation (PMC) Officers and Employees Association staged a protest in front of the municipal office on Monday, demanding the immediate release of increased GST grants intended for employee salaries and the prompt disbursement of outstanding arrears. Employees and officers also observed a one-day hunger strike to protest against the administration's policies. Mayor Syed Iqbal held discussions with the protesting staff but failed to resolve their

grievances.

The salaries and pensions of Municipal Corporation officials and employees have been pending for four to five months. Difficulties in making these payments have arisen due to reduced salary subsidies. A proposal seeking approval for additional funds was submitted to the government, and approval is currently awaited. However, the government has not yet released the GST compensation amount. This has led to disruptions in the regular payment of salaries. In view of the interruptions affecting salaries and pensions, employees

demanding that the government provide GST grants and additional funding to the Municipal Corporation. A proposal to this effect was submitted to the government. A committee constituted to address the issue subsequently submitted a report on November 4, 2025, recommending the provision of additional grants to the Municipal Corporation. Despite this, the government did not provide additional grants to the Municipal Corporation. Furthermore, while the GST grant was sanctioned, the outstanding balance representing the shortfall was not paid.

PROTEST | Farmers, agricultural labourers and workers participate in protest

Farmers stage 'Rasta Roko' over crop insurance, MSP

Demanding guaranteed remunerative prices for farm produce, crop insurance payouts, compensation for losses caused by heavy rain and withdrawal of the proposed India-US free trade agreement, farmers staged a Rasta Roko at Nandur Cross Road in Beed tehsil on the Manjarsumba-Ambajogai road on Monday.

The agitation was organised by the United Kisan Morcha, New Delhi, and the Kisan Sangharsh Samiti. Hundreds of farmers, agricultural labourers and workers participated in the protest.

Sushila Morale and Prakash Bhansali were among those who addressed the gathering. Morale alleged that the Narendra Modi government had failed to fulfil its promise, made in the 2014 Lok Sabha election manifesto, of providing farmers a remunerative price based on the cost of production plus 50% profit.

She said farmers in Beed and several other districts of Maharashtra had suffered massive losses due to heavy rainfall in 2025. According to Morale, agricultural land was damaged and topsoil was washed away, leaving thousands of farmers facing severe financial distress.

Morale claimed that a government resolution issued on April 26, 2026, made a provision of 3.06 crore for affected farmers in Beed district. She also alleged that despite assurances from the Chief Minister and Deputy Chief Minister following an aerial inspection, farmers were still awaiting the promised crop insurance compensation of 17,500 per hectare.

She further criticised the proposed India-US free trade agreement, alleging that increased imports of agricultural commodities such as soybean and maize from the



US could adversely affect Indian farmers. She demanded that the agreement be scrapped.

"Farmers are being pushed into helplessness by inadequate support. The government must ensure remunerative prices, crop insurance and compensation for losses instead of allowing agriculture to come under increasing corporate control," Morale said.

The protesters also raised issues concerning agricultural labourers and employment. Morale said agriculture continues to be a major source of employment, with a significant proportion of the rural population dependent on it, but alleged that government policies were increasingly neglecting farmers and workers.

She criticised the implementation of the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), alleging that changes made by the BJP-led government had adversely affected labourers. She also opposed the acquisition of agricultural land for infrastructure projects, claiming that thousands of acres were being taken in the name of development and forcing affected families to relocate.

The protesters also raised

concerns over the availability of schools in rural areas. Morale cited a NITI Aayog report and claimed that 92,000 schools had been closed across the country, alleging that this was affecting educational opportunities for children from farming families.

She also highlighted farmer suicides in Maharashtra and demanded effective implementation of loan-waiver schemes. According to her, announced loan waivers often remain inaccessible to farmers because of documentation and KYC-related requirements.

The protesters demanded the withdrawal of the 18% GST imposed on fertilisers, seeds and pesticides, an incentive of 2 lakh for farmers who repay their loans, and 12 hours of uninterrupted daytime electricity supply for agriculture.

Morale also demanded 10,000 per acre as compensation for farmers forced to undertake double sowing due to crop damage.

"Farmers and agricultural workers have been facing multiple crises. Rasta Roko was organised to draw the government's attention to these demands and press for immediate action," Morale said.

32 students fall ill

32 students from the Vasantrao Naik Residential Ashram School in Hanegaon, Deglur tehsil, suffered suspected food poisoning after consuming a non-vegetarian meal on Sunday night. Shortly after the meal, the students began complaining of nausea, vomiting and stomach pain, causing panic among the school administration. All the students were immediately admitted to the Government Sub-District Hospital in Deglur.

On Sunday night, students at the residential school were served a non-vegetarian meal, as is customary. About half an hour after the meal, some students began experiencing nausea, stomach pain and vomiting. Observing their condition, teachers and staff immediately took them to the hospital. Medical treatment for all the students is currently underway and, according to medical officials, their condition is stable. As a precautionary measure, the students have been kept under medical supervision. Upon learning of the incident, a large number of parents rushed to the hospital. There is an atmosphere of outrage among the parents over the distress caused to the children.

26 cops penalised as helmet drive begins

In order to reduce road accidents and the rate of deaths caused by accidents, the city police have taken a firm stand on enforcing helmet use in the city. The drive was initiated in the city on Monday by taking action against police personnel who were not using helmets. Punitive action was taken against 26 such policemen, and the drive has begun on the city roads from Tuesday onwards.

Commissioner of Police (CP) Pravin Pawar and Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Sharmishtha Garge-Walavalkar have issued orders requiring police officers and personnel to wear helmets while riding two-wheelers. Accordingly, throughout June, measures were implemented to deny entry through the main gate of the Police Commissionerate to any police officer or personnel arriving without a helmet.

Following the month-long drive, a special checking drive was conducted on Monday, during which police officers



and staff of the Police Commissionerate and various police stations were checked to determine whether they were using helmets while riding two-wheelers.

ACP Subhash Bhujang stated that fines totalling 26,000 were imposed on 26 police officers and personnel for riding two-wheelers without helmets, of which 3,000 has been collected so far.

CP Pawar had also appealed to the heads of all government and semi-government offices in the city to make helmet use mandatory for their officers and staff. Officials stated that on Tuesday, special squads from

the Traffic Branch would take punitive action against officers and employees arriving at the Collector's Office and the Divisional Commissioner's Office without helmets.

The drive to enforce helmet use has been initiated within the police department itself, rather than being limited to the general public. Following the checking of police officers and staff, officers and employees of government and semi-government offices will also be checked, and subsequent action will be taken against all two-wheeler riders in the city who fail to wear helmets.

13 modified bullet silencers seized

The district traffic police have launched a crackdown on motorcycle owners using modified silencers that produce deafening sounds and cause inconvenience to residents on city roads.

As part of a special drive conducted on Sunday, the traffic police seized modified

silencers fitted on 13 Royal Enfield Bullet motorcycles from the Mane Complex and Siddhivinayak Complex areas.

The action was carried out on the directions of Superintendent of Police Navneet Kanwat and Additional Superintendent of Police Sameer Shaikh. The special drive was conducted between 5pm and 7pm under the supervision of District Traffic Branch in-charge

Police Inspector Vaibhav Patil, Assistant Police Inspector Suresh Narwade and Police Sub-Inspector Vijay Jadhavar.

Police said complaints about loud, disruptive noise from motorcycles fitted with modified silencers had increased in the district. Taking note of these complaints, the Traffic Branch has launched a special campaign against vehicles fitted with such silencers.
