

A saffron sea engulfs Kashi as 5 lakh throng KV Dham

Tight Security, Traffic Diversion On 2nd Somvar

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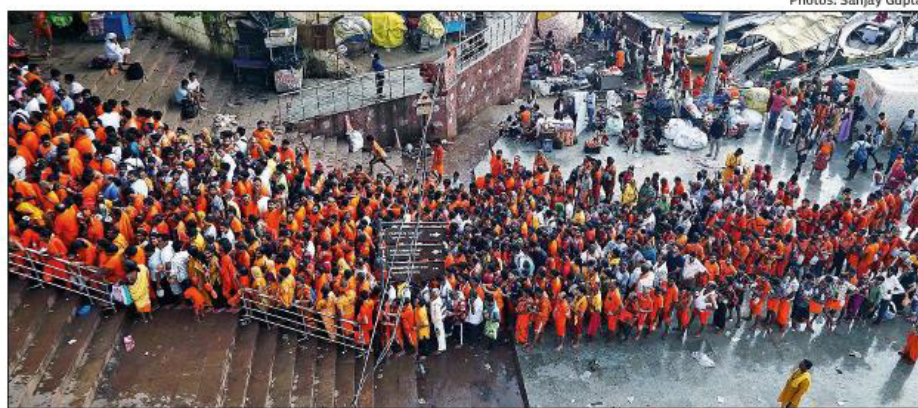
Varanasi: A sea of saffron-clad kanwariyas and devotees swept through Varanasi on the second Monday of Shrawan, with over 5 lakh pilgrims offering 'Jalabhishek' at the Kashi Vishwanath temple by 6pm. The confluence of the second Somvar and Pradosh drew a massive congregation, while the approaching Shrawan Shivratni on Tuesday kept the city's temples and routes to the shrine packed with devotees.

The heavy turnout had been anticipated by officials, who put tight security and traffic diversion plans in place from Sunday evening. The ghats along the Ganga and roads leading to Kashi Vishwanath turned saffron as massive groups of kanwariyas thronged the city. Long queues had formed even before the sanctum sanctorum of the Kashi Vishwanath temple opened.

The scale of the congregation was evident from the early figures. Within six hours of the sanctum opening around 4 am, over 2.6 lakh kanwariyas and pilgrims had offered Jalabhishek. The pace of entry eased in the afternoon, but by 6 pm, temple administration figures showed that the number of devotees had crossed the 5-lakh mark, while long queues continued to build up on routes leading to the shrine.

Priests said a large number of kanwariyas had chosen to reach Kashi by Monday night and offer 'Jalabhishek' on the occasion of Shrawan Shivratni on Tuesday. This helped divide the crowd pressure over two days, with kanwariyas arriving by late afternoon showing less urgency to reach the temple.

Earlier, as the sanctum opened amid flower petals being showered on devotees, dis-

tract magistrate Satyendra Kumar inspected arrangements in and around the temple. He reviewed sanitation, drinking water, movement, security and crowd management and directed officials to ensure services remained smooth and responsive throughout the day.

During the inspection, Kumar interacted with devotees waiting in queues and sought feedback on basic facilities, cleanliness, drinking water,

traffic flow and access to the temple. He also reviewed control room operations and CCTV surveillance to assess security arrangements.

Officials, including commissioner of police Mohit Agrawal, continued to monitor Kashi Vishwanath and other prominent Shiva temples. On the second Monday, devotees also got a glimpse of Lord Vishwanath's Gauri-Shankar form. Visitors chanted "Har Har Mahadev" on witnessing

the deity's decoration while offering prayers.

Other prominent Shiva temples, including Markandeya Mahadev at the Ganga-Gomti confluence in Kaithi, Sarangnath at Sarnath, Vishwanath temple on the BHU campus, Tilbhandeshwar, Gauri Kedareswar, Onkaleswar, Jageshwar, Rameshwar, Shooltankeshwar, Kardmeshwar and Mrityunjaya Mahadev, also remained heavily crowded.

Man arrested for stealing valuables from flyers' luggage

Varanasi: Phulpur police in Varanasi arrested a person, Mukesh Patel (26), on Sunday evening for allegedly stealing gold jewellery from the trolley bag of a woman passenger, when she was flying from Chandigarh to Varanasi via Delhi in July.

Phulpur police in-charge Rajeev Singh on Monday said police arrested Patel from a wedding lawn on Mangari road and seized stolen gold chain, mangalsutra and four earrings along with Rs 400 cash from his possession.

Patel confessed that the jewellery worth Rs 7 lakh

belonged to complainants, including passenger Archana Yadav and Shivam Singh.

According to sources, Shivam Singh lodged a complaint on July 15 alleging that two pairs of ear-

rings and a mangalsutra were missing from his trolley bag during his journey from Chandigarh to Varanasi on Delhi to IndiGo flights.

Police began investigation when a similar complaint was lodged by Yadav on July 19 alleging that jewellery kept in her bag went missing when she was travelling from Ahmedabad to Varanasi on IndiGo flight.

2 held for bid to convert villagers

Varanasi: Two men were arrested on Sunday evening for allegedly attempting to induce villagers to convert to Christianity by holding a prayer session at a house in Gauri village. Police said they recovered material related to the propagation of Christianity and alleged that the accused were offering money and promising future financial benefits to villagers.

Baburi police station sub-inspector Sanjit Kumar Singh said on Monday that, after being alerted by a group of villagers, a police team raided the residence of Ashok, where several villagers were allegedly being influenced to leave Hinduism and adopt Christianity. During raid, police found that the accused were allegedly offering money and promising future financial benefits while distributing material related to the propagation of Christianity. Following investigation, police arrested Ashish Narayan of Badgawan village under Shahabganj police station and Ashok of Gauri village under Baburi police station. TNN

Kidnapping case accused caught after encounter

Varanasi: A man accused of kidnapping a 16-year-old deaf & mute girl on Aug 1 was arrested after exchange of fire with Muhammadabad and Nonahra police personnel near Ghauspur airstrip under the limits of Muhammadabad police station in Ghazipur district in the wee-hours of Monday.

After taking stock of the incident site, Ghazipur CO (Muhammadabad) Sudhakar Pandey said that during night patrolling on Sunday night, Muhammadabad police were alerted by informers regarding movement of persons involved in kidnapping the deaf & mute girl between Tiwaripur and Gauspur when they moved towards the area and also alerted Nonahra police.

On spotting two motorcycle-borne persons, policemen signalled them to stop but they sped towards Kathwa Mod, said Pandey. When the motorcycle-borne persons found themselves sur-

rounded by police near Ghauspur airstrip, they opened fire at the police team in their bid to escape. When police fired back, one of them sustained a bullet injury in his leg and was caught. His accomplice managed to escape.

After recovering a community-made pistol, cartridges and a motorcycle police rushed the injured criminal, Vijayi, 34, of Badhaipura in Muhammadabad, to hospital. Pandey said the teams intensified efforts to nab the accomplice of Vijayi, who managed to abscond.

On Aug 1, the minor deaf & mute girl was grazing her goats near the Greenfield Expressway in Barji village when Vijayi and his accomplice had kidnapped her. Using CCTV footage and surveillance, police rescued the kidnapped girl within 30 hours from a house in Pahuta village of Saidpur. An accomplice of kidnappers Rukma Devi was arrested for harboring the kidnappers.

2 killed, 1 hurt as motorcycle hits truck in Ghazipur

Varanasi: Two youths were killed and another suffered critical injuries when their motorcycle collided with a truck on Gorakhpur-Varanasi four-lane highway near Audihar village under Saidpur police station in Ghazipur district late on Sunday.

Ghazipur circle officer (Saidpur) Shubham Verma on Monday said that three youths riding a motorcycle were passing through Audihar turning, when their vehicle collided head-on with a truck coming from opposite direction. All three identified as Lalu Yadav (25), Akash Yadav (25) and Raju Yadav (27) of Uchauri village in Saidpur suffered grave injuries.

They were rushed to Saidpur community health centre (CHC), where doctors declared Akash and Raju dead. Lalu, who sustained serious in-

juries, was given first aid and referred to trauma centre of BHU in Varanasi. Bodies of Akash and Raju were later sent for postmortem.

Police arrested the truck driver. During initial investigation, it came to light that the three friends left homes on a motorcycle to visit Markandey Mahadev Dham on Varanasi-Ghazipur border around 10pm on Sunday. After travelling a few kilometers, the met with the accident.

Akash was youngest among six siblings and was married three years ago. Raju, who worked as a labourer in Mumbai, had returned home two weeks ago to take care of his wife Preeti, who recently gave birth to a baby girl.

Women stitch patriotism, 3L flags for I-Day

Varanasi: As Independence Day approaches, Varanasi is gearing up to spread the message of patriotism and women's empowerment through 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign, with around 800 women associated with self-help groups (SHGs) preparing nearly 3 lakh national flags for distribution across the district.

Working from their homes and community groups, the women are preparing the tricolours. The initiative is expected to generate an income of around Rs6 lakh to Rs9 lakh for women associated with SHGs, while also providing them an opportunity to become economically self-reliant.

Varanasi has 694 gram panchayats across eight development blocks, and the administration is making arrangements to ensure that the national flags reach every gram panchayat. Of the total target,

around 2.70 lakh flags will be supplied to the 694 gram panchayats, 25,000 to the Basic Education Department and 5,000 to the District Youth Welfare Department.

Officials said the initiative aimed not only at ensuring the hoisting of the tricolour at homes on August 15 but also at creating livelihood opportunities for rural women. Chief development officer Prakhar Kumar Singh said women associated with self-help groups were preparing the flags from their homes, giving them an opportunity to earn while contributing to the national

campaign. He said the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign would strengthen patriotic sentiment while providing further impetus to women's empowerment and the rural economy. Each tricolour prepared by the women, he added, would symbolise not only national pride but also their labour, skill and growing economic independence.

Deputy Commissioner, Self Employment, Pawan Kumar Singh said the flags were being prepared strictly according to the prescribed standards. He said the tricolours made by women in

Kashi and delivered to households would carry the message of patriotism across the holy city on Independence Day. For the women involved, the campaign is also an emotional connection with the nation.

Neha, a member of the Pita Parmeshwar SHG from Arjunpur village in Sevapuri block, said women were preparing the tricolours together while singing and listening to Vande Mataram. She said the atmosphere remained filled with patriotic fervour during the work. Soni, a member of Kiran SHG from Keshariapur village in Kashi Vidyapeeth block, said women were earning an income by preparing national flags from their homes. She said women in Kashi were working hard to contribute to the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign while moving towards economic self-reliance.

Similarly, Khushboo and Mamta of Suraj SHG from Thathermanpur village said the campaign was both a symbol of patriotism and a means of strengthening women's empowerment.
