An elderly man was allegedly humiliated in public after he kicked a cow while trying to move it from the road in Guna. The incident took place in Jamner town of Madhya Pradesh. A viral video of the scene has surfaced on social media on Thursday. What appeared as a civic issue of stray cattle on roads quickly turned communal, with Bajrang Dal members alleging that the elderly tried to disrespect 'Gau Mata.'



tion available, the elderly man, Jameeluddin, a resident of Guna Cantonment, had gone to Jamner to deliver goods at a resident's house. While un-

loading the goods from a pickup vehicle, he reportedly tried to move a cow sitting on the road by kicking it.

After the incident, members of the Bajrang Dal and other Hindu groups gathered at the spot. As the situation became tense, some local families sheltered the elderly man inside their home.

However, he was later forced to bow before the cow and apologise by rubbing his nose on the ground.

Jamner police station in-charge Manoj Mehra said the incident happened four days ago and that people present at

the spot questioned the elderly man, following which he apologised. He said no written complaint had been received from either side, so no legal action had been taken. However, Jameeluddin has alleged that when he approached the police, he was not heard. He claimed that police officials made him write on a blank paper that he did not want any further action and had apologised voluntarily. The elderly man has said he will approach the district Superintendent of Police with a written complaint and seek action over the alleged public humiliation.

Mother, son killed in bike collision

A 40-year-old woman and her 20-year-old son were killed in a head-on collision between two motorcycles on the Lahar-Sikri road near Sikri Jagir on Thursday afternoon. Two people riding the other motorcycle were injured.

The deceased were identified as Guddi Devi (40) and her son Chhotu alias Digvijay (20), residents of Lalpura. They died at the spot due to serious injuries. The injured, Aman Singh Rajawat (21) and Bhagwandas (45), were taken to Lahar Civil Hospital by a 108 ambulance. Police reached the spot, sent the bodies for post-mortem and began investigating the circumstances of the accident, including the speed of the motorcycles.

Court admits Pratima Devi's claim in Scindia property dispute

The Gwalior District Court on Thursday admitted a property claim by Union Minister Jyoti-raditya Scindia's great-aunt Pratima Devi in the Scindia royal family's Rs 41,000 crore property dispute.

The order allows Pratima Devi to present her claim and supporting documents but does not grant her a share in the property. Pratima Devi, who lives in Kathmandu, claims an equal share on the ground that her mother, Padmaraje Scindia, belonged to the royal family. Her son-in-law Pratik Karki represented her in

court. She had earlier raised objections over access to the will and related documents and questioned notices allegedly sent to her Nepalganj address. The other party claims she had consented to an agreement and signed relevant documents. The court fixed Oct 7 for the next hearing.

Drivers flee, sand trolleys seized

Morena: Civil Lines police seized two tractor-trolleys allegedly transporting illegal sand from the Chambal River near White House in Bismil Nagar. Police said the drivers fled after seeing a checkpoint, abandoning the vehicles. The tractor-trolleys, valued at around Rs 2 lakh, were seized and handed over to the forest department for further confiscation proceedings.

Woman jumps off bridge into river, rescued

A commotion erupted on Thursday at the old Nepri bridge when a 26-year-old woman suddenly jumped into the river. This caused panic among the people present at the scene. Meanwhile, an e-rickshaw driver, fearing for his own life, jumped into the river to save the woman. According to reports, the woman was identified as 26-year-old Babli Gaur. It is being reported that she took this suicidal step for unknown reasons. Seeing the woman jumping from the bridge into the river, an e-rickshaw driver immediately came to her aid. He jumped into the river and tried to catch her, and after considerable effort, pulled her out safely.

The woman's life was saved due to the e-rickshaw driver's

promptness and courage. Following the incident, a large crowd gathered at the scene, praising the e-rickshaw driver's bravery. The Morena police and administration were informed of the incident, and a police team arrived at the scene.

Morena Police attempted to gather information from the woman regarding the incident. However, the circumstances under which the woman jumped into the river are currently unclear. Police are investigating the matter and are also gathering information from the woman's family.

The woman is currently safe and police are investigating the incident. Whether the woman jumped into the river was due to family, personal, or other reasons will only be clear after the investigation is complete.

Police destroy 5,200Lt illicit liquor

Police intensified their campaign against illicit liquor, raiding illegal liquor dens operating in forests and along riverbanks in Chanderi and Piprai areas.

According to police, around 5,200 litres of liquor were destroyed at various locations and 150 litres of raw liquor seized. Police also destroyed equipment and sites used for manufacturing liquor.

In Mungawali area, six excise cases were registered within 24 hours. In Sardarpur area, a suspect was arrested



with 60 litres of illicit liquor. Police initiated action under the Excise Act.

Police are investigating the network involved in manufacturing and supplying illicit liquor. Surveillance is also being intensified in forests, riverbanks and other isolated areas.

24 held in district-wide liquor crackdown

Morena: Police arrested 24 suspects and registered 23 cases during a district-wide crackdown on illegal liquor on Wednesday. The action was carried out under the direction of superintendent of police Dharamraj Meena and additional superintendent of police Surendra Pal Singh Dawar. Police recovered 126 litres of illegal Indian and foreign liquor, estimated to be worth Rs 61,990. Cases were registered under the Excise Act. Police registered five cases in Ambah, two each in Civil Lines, Kailaras and Rampur, and one each in Kotwali, Station Road, Dimni, Sihoniya, Porsa, Nagra, Mahua, Bamor, Noorabad, Jaura, Baghchini and Chinouni.

Upper caste groups stage protest against reservation

The Samajik Nyay Sangharsh Samiti, along with the Parshuram Sena and other social organisations, organised a major protest in Gwalior on Thursday, raising five key demands related to UGC regulations, reservation and social policies. Protesters gathered at the ground opposite the Rani Lakshmbai Samadhi in Phoolbagh, with participants also arriving from Indore, Jaipur, Bhind, Morena, Datia and nearby districts.

The protesters demanded the rollback of the UGC Bill and reform of the reservation



system, with reservation benefits to be based on economic criteria. They also demanded that compensation to victims under the SC/ST Act be stopped at the FIR stage and that a preliminary inquiry be conducted before registration of an FIR.

The protesters further demanded an equal education system with equal opportun-

ities for all sections. Their most important demand was the formation of a Savarna Aayog (Savarna Commission) to address issues concerning the Savarna community.

Security arrangements were tightened in and around Phoolbagh, with police deployment and traffic diversions put in place during the protest.

HC orders independent audit of faulty I-T system

The Madhya Pradesh High Court principal seat has ordered an independent audit of its I-T system by a team of experts, including officers from C-DOT and personnel from private IT firms. The audit must be completed within 30 days and its report submitted to the court.

The directions came after lawyers raised concerns over glitches and poor functioning of the High Court's new website, saying the old website worked better.

A division bench of Justice Vivek Agarwal and Justice AK Singh noted that more than 15

days had passed since an Aug 25/26, 2026 WhatsApp message indicated that the website update would take eight days. "We take a very serious view that our judicial time has been wasted due to incompetence of the IT staff," the bench said.

The court suggested experts from TCS, Infosys, L&T Technology Services, C-DOT and "MASSCOM" for the audit. It also sought an explanation from HC registrar (IT CSA) KS Kushwaha over obstacles affecting the High Court's functioning.

The bench directed that action be taken against delinquent staff and that a report be submitted within seven days.

Farmers flag entry fee irregularities

Jabalpur : Alleged irregularities in entry fee collection have surfaced at Jabalpur division's largest agricultural produce market, with farmers claiming they are charged Rs 10 per heap while slips show the fee as zero.

Vehicles carrying agricultural produce are issued entry slips containing farmers' details and crop weight. Farmers alleged that rs 10 is collected for each heap, but the amount is not recorded on the slips.

It is claimed that around 1,000 to 1,500 vehicles reach the market daily, rising to 2,000 to 2,500 during the season. Questions have been raised over where the alleged collections are deposited.

Sihora clinic raided, medical supplies seized

An alleged illegal clinic operating from a house in Ward No. 13 of Sai Mangalam Colony, Sihora, was raided by a joint team of the administration and health department. Officials found that operator Preeti Kewat allegedly had neither a registered medical degree nor clinic registration.

The team seized medicines, injections and medical supplies, some marked "Not for Sale" and "Government Supply". Abortion and delivery-related medicines, equipment used in

DNC procedures and blood bags were also recovered.

Chief medical and health officer (CMHO) Naveen Kohari said action had earlier been taken against the clinic in August, but the operator had left the spot. The latest raid was conducted after officials learnt that the clinic had resumed operations. The operation was videographed and officials are preparing to file an FIR against Kewat. The sources of the government medicines and blood bags are being investigated.

Thieves cut, steal power lines

Jabalpur: Thieves targeted agricultural feeders in Shahpura and Chargawan areas, cutting and stealing 11 KV high-tension power lines from dozens of poles.

The theft came to light after farmers complained about power outages. Electricity department staff reached the affected areas and found the poles intact but the wires missing.

In Khirkakheda, Shahpura, wires were stolen from 19 poles. In Chargawan, thieves allegedly cut a nearly two-kilometre power line from about 21 poles supplying agricultural pumps.

Agroforestry improves soil, conserves water

The special lecture was organized on "agroforestry: climate-resilient agriculture and green economy in the era of climate change" in the Jawaharlal Nehru Krishi Vishwavidyalaya Jabalpur on Thursday.

Jawaharlal Nehru Krishi Vishwavidyalaya, vice chancellor Dr. Pramod Kumar Mishra, Jabalpur, the Department of Forestry organized a special lecture on "Agroforestry: Climate-Resilient Agriculture and Green Economy in the Era of Climate Change" at the Swami Vivekananda Audi-

torium. During the program, the keynote speaker, Dr. SK Dhyani, former Director of ICAR-CAFRI, explained the agroforestry creates a natural protective shield to safeguard farms from weather extremities.

Chief Guest Dr. Dharendra Khare highlighted the challenges anticipated by 2047, pointing out that agricultural landholdings will shrink in the future, necessitating proper mechanization. He also emphasized the efficient and optimal use of resources to achieve higher yields on limited land.

Man held with 24 psychotropic injections

Jabalpur: Police arrested 35-year-old Badku Sonkar in Gorakhpur and seized 24 psychotropic injections and Rs 3,950 cash. Police said Sonkar was allegedly selling Buprenorphine and Pheniramine Maleate injections from his residence. During a raid, police found 11 Buprenorphine and 13 Pheniramine Maleate injections hidden in an unused refrigerator in a room containing scrap material. Police said Sonkar allegedly bought the substances to sell them to local addicts at inflated prices. He was booked under Section 8/21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

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CSP NEHA PACHISIA MOVES HC TO QUASH FIR

Jabalpur: Suspended CSP Neha Pachisia has moved the High Court seeking quashing of an FIR registered against her for alleged criminal conspiracy, fraud and misuse of position.

An FIR has been registered against four people, including Pachisia, at Kuthla police station

in Katni district. She is accused of striking a deal with a murder suspect and getting land worth Rs 1 crore transferred in the names of her acquaintances for Rs 18 lakh in exchange for acquitting him. She is also accused of demanding a bribe of Rs 20,000 from a transporter. Pachisia's of-

fice was sealed and she was attached to the DIG's office. According to the copy, Pachisia has been absconding since the FIR was registered. A case is also pending in Katni district court, where there is a demand to confiscate her property and declare her absconding.

22 MP Transco engineers get higher pay scale

Jabalpur : Madhya Pradesh Power Transmission Company (MP Transco) has granted a higher pay scale to 22 executive engineers under the second option of the 18-year rule. MP Transco chief engineer (HR) Dharendra Singh said this was the first time employees of a cadre received the benefit the day after becoming eligible, following implementation of the ERP system.

Woman officer assaulted at panchayat office

Jabalpur: Project manager Anjula Jha was allegedly assaulted at the district panchayat office on Thursday. The incident was captured on CCTV cameras. Jha was investigating assistant block manager Aarti Soni in connection with a matter. Aarti reached the office with her husband Yogesh, who allegedly abused Jha and assaulted her with kicks, punches and slaps.
